Most of the students arrived at the school and hostels at the beginning of July. Some new admissions are still being taken. We have started having Mary's Meal regularly. Matric students came to collect their exam results and some students shared sweets with the staff members. We have started making weekly lesson plans. One day, we held a drawing competition for the entire school. The new students have joined the school houses. We provided new school diaries for all students. On 8th July, all staff members, collaborating Sisters, and cooks went to Hazaribag to attend a legal awareness program for child protection/ safeguarding. On 21st July, we had interhouse boys' football and girls' volleyball matches. On the same day, 47 students, both girls, went for a boys and "Vriksharopan" (Tree Plantation) program with BSF jawans near the Holy Cross Hospital. For a few days, our Headmaster **Fr. Theodore** was busy catching up on some backlog work. During that time, **Fr. Lawrence** stepped in to teach English classes for 9th and 10th standards.

This year, we participated in the Subroto Cup football tournament and reached the semi-finals. On one day from the 7th to the 10th, the students elected the Students' Cabinet (Baal Sansad). By now, all the students have memorized the Preamble of the Constitution of India in both Hindi and English, which they recite every day during the school assembly. There is an outbreak of conjunctivitis in the school and hostels, causing many children to go home. Earlier in the month, a few new and young students ran away from the school and hostels. Thankfully, our dedicated search was successful and some of them safely returned home. This year, the celebration of St. Ignatius Loyola feast day was much better, although there is still room for improvement. We sacrificed a fattened pig for the joy of everyone.

Our regent **Sch. Benison** is busy working in the school, hostel, and community. Using his own creativity and with the guidance of **Fr. Theodore**, he is planting vegetables. **Fr. Theodore** has taken the initiative to grow some crops for the hostel in certain plots of our Hutpa land. We have purchased more rice for the hostel. Our tube wells have been repaired and our hostel septic tank has been cleaned by professionals.

Fr. Lawrence was unwell for a few days and received better care in the Holy Cross hospital. **Benison** also fell ill, but he was strong enough to stay active. He attended the regents' recollection in Hazaribagh. **Fr. Manjeet**, the Novice Master of SSC, came to give a recollection for the whole community. We had a devotional novena prayer in honor of St. Ignatius of Loyola. One day, **Fr. Cyril** went to Ranchi to see his doctor and **Fr. Theodore** accompanied him to buy some footballs and volleyballs for the school and hostels. There were not many mangoes in our garden this year, but it was enough for us. We thank everyone who helped in planting and taking care of them.

On the last Saturday of this month, Tertians of SSC Sitagarh visited us on their way back from Dhori Mata, Jarangdih pilgrimage. We had a good interaction with them regarding our mission here.

Patra Mission



These days, we have been busy with our daily field visits and village tours. Starting this month, we have arranged village meetings during the day and Satsang Prayers in the evening. This month, we were able to reinstall Malik and Chadidar in the villages of Gali, Gondalpura, and Peparadhia. There was an unexpected incident that occurred at Rajhar Hostel. St. Alphonsa and St. Ignatius Day were celebrated at Shanti Niketan School in Babupara, where students showcased their talents for the audience. Many students performed English stories and poems. We also invited all the collaborators, including school teachers, sisters, ankur tutors, social workers, and catechists to celebrate St. Ignatius of Loyola feast. The main celebrant was **Fr. Rajender Tete**, and we sincerely thank him for his generosity. Practically all the teachers from the schools presented something in honor of the great Saint. The event was covered in the local news, and it was a wonderful time to share our joys and sorrows together. We also celebrated Loyola day at Rajhar Hostel, where students displayed their talents and abilities through songs and dances. Our tailoring program is progressing well, with many girls coming to learn. However, six girls from Tarwa Centre came and left within two days due to various problems.

Consultations are still ongoing to minimize future risks. The provincial's visit on July 24th was a blessing and a source of consolation. We presented



him with several proposals for new projects, such as Eco STEM, computer classes, remedial classes, and English tuition, to address the needs of underprivileged students. Meanwhile, I familiarized myself with the local train system by visiting notable places in Mumbai. Additionally, the three of us visited slums in Kalwa and villages in Shahpur and Raigarh districts for a feasibility study.

Currently, my main task is to cater to the pastoral needs of Hindi-speaking migrants in St. Peter's Church, Bandra. I offer a monthly Mass for them. He has arranged for his assistant to show me some of the difficulties faced by migrants and the crowded spots where they gather.

To improve my capabilities, I attended a seminar on "Workshop on Capacity Building" regarding migrants, organized by ISI Bangalore from July 26th to 28th. There were 42 participants from across India, and it was an eye-opening experience that highlighted the various levels of migration. We all recognized the need for collective organizations at both the source and destination states to support distressed migrants. As individuals, we should step forward to meet the emerging challenges faced by migrants throughout India and abroad. We concluded that a migration commission/forum may be necessary at the provincial and assistancy levels.

Province Delegates at MAGIS 2023 and WYD, Portugal
